## Welcome to Winter 2021/2022

As the weather cools and winter storms begin to roll in, we wanted to remind residents of our snow policies.

The district has a contract with Brightview to clear all right-of-way sidewalks on, or adjacent to, common tracts owned by the district. They also clear the main park sidewalks and manage snow removal for the two parking lots adjacent to the pool and tennis courts, as well as the park at the southeast corner of Keystone Boulevard and Aventerra Parkway.

Snow removal operations are triggered anytime there is an accumulation of more than two inches in depth. Additionally, the district's contract with Brightview calls for their teams to begin snow removal operations within twelve hours after snowfall has ceased, or as conditions safely permit. It is important to note that snow removal on the adjacent public streets throughout the district
